### **SCHOOL SAVINGS BONUS**

The Victorian Government has granted \$400 to every student enrolled at a Government School. However accessing these funds can only be through the portal via this <u>link</u>

You will have received an email from the Department of Education School Savings Bonus team with your login and password. If you have not received this or require it to be re-sent please contact the SSB team on 1800 338 663. The school office unfortunately does not have access to this information and therefore are unable to assist with your login details.

The SSB funds can only be utilised for uniform and activities (eg. camps, swimming, excursions and incursions) *Please note: SSB cannot go towards Curriculum Contributions*. To assist our families with the payment for these events we kindly ask all parents and carers to transfer the full these funds (eg. \$400) to the school *(or your remaining balance if you have already utilised some for uniform)*, by allocating it to 'Activities.'

This will reduce the amount parents/carers normally would pay for activities .

Once you've transferred funds to the school we will automatically adjust/reduce events allowing you to consent in Compass.

# **STEM News**

# **STEM Exploration at KGPS**

As your child's new STEM teacher, I'm excited to participate in engaging hands-on, interactive learning experiences with KGPS students. My plan for this year is to have students explore the world of science, technology, engineering, and math in fun and creative ways through construction and designed solutions that challenge student's problem-solving skills. My goal is to nurture curiosity, critical thinking, and teamwork while helping students develop skills that are essential in today's world.

#### **STEM Careers with Grade Prep**

Prep students recently had the chance to explore the future and various STEM careers. They dressed up in costumes representing different STEM jobs. They looked adorable while stepping into the shoes of scientists, engineers, doctors, chefs and pilots. They had a chance to act out how it might feel to be in that job through role-playing. The students had a blast pretending to carry out these jobs.

#### **Building Towers with Year 1**

Recent STEM lessons had the students building towers using cups and spaghetti. The goal of the lessons was to explore the impact of different base shapes and sizes on the stability of a structure. Students were tasked with building towers using a narrow base and then a wide base, to see how each design affected the tower's ability to stand tall and stable. Through trial and error, they quickly discovered that towers with wider bases were more stable, as they provided a stronger foundation. They learned that triangles, with their wide base, can carry more weight, and are the strongest shape when building.

#### Saving 'Fred' with Year 2.

Year two were learning to work as a team to solve a problem. The task involved saving Fred (a gummy worm) when his boat capsized. They were given a paper clip and were tasked with making a tool that helped with this problem. While designing a useful new tool, students learned that the shape of an object helps it function. They also discovered the importance of working together to complete a task with a common goal.








# **Uniform Reminders**
