#24 The Power of Inquiry

The Power of Inquiry in PYP

At Keysborough Gardens Primary School, inquiry is at the heart of the Primary Years Programme (PYP). Inquiry drives our students' learning by encouraging them to ask questions, explore and reflect on their understanding of the world around them. This approach nurtures curiosity and fosters a love for learning that lasts a lifetime.

What is Inquiry?

Inquiry is a process where students actively engage in their learning by asking questions, investigating, and constructing new understandings. It allows students to take ownership of their learning and develop critical thinking skills.

How Inquiry Works:

- Questioning: Students start by asking open-ended questions about topics they are curious about.
- Investigating: Through research and exploration, students gather information and make discoveries.
- Connecting: Students make connections between their new knowledge and what they already know.
- Reflecting: Reflection helps students consider what they have learned and how they can apply it.

Benefits of Inquiry:

- Engagement: Inquiry makes learning more engaging and relevant.
- Critical Thinking: Students develop skills to think critically and solve problems.
- Ownership: Students take responsibility for their learning, which boosts confidence and motivation








