Kiss n' Go changes

• What has changed? The Kiss and Go area is now a 2-hour parking zone.

• What should I do? If parking spaces are available, you may park in the area (please do not form a queue).



We recommend parking at Woolworths or in neighbouring streets (ensuring you do not block driveways) and walking to a pre-arranged meeting spot such as the playgrounds, basketball court, or school gates. Families of Years 3-6 students are encouraged to consider walking, riding, or scootering home if they live nearby.

Any students who have not been picked up by 3:45pm will be taken to the office. Parking on the housing side of Homeleigh Road is <u>illegal</u> and families run the risk of a fine if they do so. Please do not drop your child off on the opposite side of the school and have them walk across the road. There have been near misses in the past, where students have almost been hit by cars. <u>Please USE THE</u> <u>SCHOOL CROSSING AT ALL TIMES.</u>



No Riding bikes/ Scooters in the yard

A reminder that children need to wear a helmet to and from school if they are riding their bike or scooter.

Children need to discmount from their bikes and scooters at the school gate and are not to rider in the school grounds before or after school.



Double Parking

Please do not double park when collecting your child after school. This is extremely dangerous as it means that children are walking between cars, creating an unsafe environment.

EDUCATION SUB-COMMITTEE

Purpose: To develop and review school policy, contribute to School Strategic Plan, and facilitate regular communication within the school community relating to school & DET initiatives, programs and policies. It will:

- Formulate and present an Annual Action Plan to the first meeting of the new Council each year. (March/April)
- Review current school policies (in a standard template format) on a cyclic basis; identify new policy needs in response to Council directions.
- Ensure school policies are readily accessible throughout the school community.
- Recommend and monitor processes for ensuring parent, teacher and community participation.

BUILDINGS AND GROUNDS SUB-COMMITTEE

Purpose: To maintain, develop and improve the physical environment and safety of our school buildings and grounds. It will:

- Formulate and present an Annual Action Plan to the first meeting of the new Council each year. (March/April)
- Organise 3-4 Working Bees per year
- Identify and implement an annual 'Committee Project' each year, with wider parental involvement according to expertise within the school community.
- Oversee the safety and adequate maintenance of school grounds, facilities and playground equipment.





FUNDRAISING AND COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT SUB-COMMITTEE

Purpose: To promote parental and student connectedness and participation in the life of the school through social events. It will:

- Formulate and present an Annual Action Plan to the first meeting of the new Council each year. (April)
- Conduct Social Functions for parents and students, producing a 'Calendar of Events'.
- Actively recruit/engage new parents to become involved in the organisation of events.
- Co-ordinate Class Representatives and maintain a voluntary school classroom contact list.
