From the Principal- Mrs Jenkins 2025 Planning

Planning for 2025 is now well underway, including the process of compiling our 23 classes. Teachers and school leaders have commenced this complex and carefully planned process, aiming to have all classes finalised by late November. The effort and professional judgement that teachers dedicate to compiling classes is greatly appreciated, as they utilise their knowledge of students and families to ensure thoughtful class placements.

While we continue to create Home Groups (classes), it's important to highlight that students spend a significant amount of time working with peers outside their immediate class groups. Across each level, students collaborate in our flexible teaching spaces, allowing us to deliver rich and diverse learning experiences.

Compiling 2025 Classes

Each year, a small number of parents submit feedback and special requests regarding class placements. These requests must be submitted in writing and addressed to the Principal by Thursday, 28th November. While we carefully consider all feedback, it's important to note that not all requests can be accommodated.

As part of the process, students are asked to list several friends they'd like to be with, and we aim to ensure they are with at least one of these friends. However, requests for specific named friends from parents cannot be accommodated due to the complexity of balancing all factors in the class placement process.

2025 School Structure

Our school will see continued growth in 2025, increasing from 430 students to approximately 475 students. With this growth, we will move from 20 to 23 classes, maintaining an average class size of approximately 21 students.

Further information, including 2025 class teachers, will be published in the newsletter in approximately two weeks.

As with all schools, staffing changes accompany growth. You may have already seen some of our 2025 staff introduced in recent newsletters, with further introductions and some farewells to come in the coming weeks.



Learner Profile: Risk-Takers

Being a risk-taker is an important attribute in the Primary Years Programme (PYP) at Keysborough Gardens Primary School. We encourage our students to approach uncertainty with courage and to explore new ideas and innovative strategies.

What does it mean to be a Risk-Taker?

A risk-taker is someone who is willing to try new things, face challenges, and make mistakes as part of the learning process.

How We Cultivate Risk-Taking:

- Encouraging Exploration: Providing opportunities for students to explore new topics and ideas.
- Creating a Safe Environment: Ensuring that the classroom is a safe space where students feel comfortable taking risks and making mistakes.
- Problem-Solving Activities: Engaging students in activities that require them to think creatively and take initiative.
- Celebrating Effort: Recognising and celebrating the effort and process, not just the outcome.

Benefits of Being a Risk-Taker:

- Resilience: Risk-takers develop resilience and the ability to bounce back from setbacks.
- Innovation: Taking risks leads to new ideas and innovative solutions.
- Confidence: Students gain confidence as they successfully navigate challenges and uncertainties.

Encouraging Risk-Taking at Home:

- Support New Experiences: Encourage your child to try new activities and hobbies.
- Model Risk-Taking: Show your child how you take risks and learn from your experiences.
- Positive Reinforcement: Praise your child for their efforts and bravery, regardless of the outcome.
