






🏲 Prep Provocation! 🏲



Cultural Celebrations

This week brings an exciting blend of cultural celebrations with Halloween and Diwali coinciding on the same day! At Keysborough Gardens Primary School, we embrace the opportunity to learn about different traditions, as it reflects our commitment to fostering international-mindedness and respect for diverse cultures within our school community.

Diwali - The Festival of Lights

Diwali, also known as the Festival of Lights, is one of the most significant celebrations in Hindu, Sikh, and Jain cultures. Diwali symbolises the victory of light over darkness and good over evil. Originating in India, this celebration has roots in various stories from Hindu mythology. One of the most well-known is the return of Lord Rama to his kingdom after 14 years in exile. 
