Safer Internet Day

This Tuesday marked this year's Safer Internet Day, a day dedicated to promoting a safer and more responsible use of online technology and mobile phones, especially among children and young people across the world. At Keysborough Gardens Primary School, we are committed to ensuring the digital safety of our students, employing the Department of Education's content filter to block access to content or apps deemed inappropriate for children.

We understand, however, that it is not always possible to shield our children from every unsettling or distressing piece of news on the internet. Therefore, we place a strong emphasis on educating our students about internet safety and how to handle content they may stumble upon outside of school. Key messages we impart include:

- Turning off the screen and speaking to an adult immediately if something viewed makes them feel uncomfortable.
- Avoiding responses to unsolicited messages or communications from unknown individuals.
- Sharing with parents the apps, websites, channels and social media they use.
- Engaging only with digital platforms appropriate for their age group.

In our approach to teaching internet safety, we strive to maintain a balance, acknowledging the internet and digital devices as invaluable tools for learning and entertainment, while also fostering an age-appropriate understanding of the risks involved.

What Does Integrating the PYP at Home Mean?

Incorporating the PYP at home means creating an environment where inquiry, curiosity and lifelong learning are encouraged and celebrated. It's about seeing opportunities for learning in everyday activities and conversations. Here are some practical ways you can integrate PYP principles into your family routine:

1. Encourage Curiosity and Inquiry:

 During family time, encourage your children to ask questions about the world around them. It could be as simple as discussing how plants grow while gardening or exploring the stars during a night walk.

2. Develop a Weekly Family Goal:

 Set a weekly learning goal based on a PYP value such as open-mindedness or caring. This could involve activities like trying a recipe from a different culture or doing a kindness project for a neighbor.

3. Promote Reflective Thinking:

 Have regular family discussions where everyone shares what they learned that day. This could be during dinner or a dedicated family meeting time.

4. Create an Inquiry-Based Project:

• Work on a small project together that aligns with your child's interests and inquiries at school. For example, if they're learning about ecosystems, you could start a small herb garden or build a bird feeder.

5. Model Lifelong Learning:

• Share your own learning experiences with your children. Let them see you engage in reading, taking up a new hobby, or learning a new skill.
